Stop t	op the following medications on:													
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- 1. Stop all aspirin and aspirin containing products (Ibuprofen) 5 days before test. You can take extra strength Tylenol.
- 2. Stop all arthritis medication 5 days before test (Celebrex, Mobic, Ultram, Voltaren, Plaquenil)
- 3. Stop all Blood Thinners 5 days before test. (Coumadin, Warfarin, Plavix, Pradaxa, Xarelto, Effient)

If possible, try to have a bowel movement at least 1 hour prior to this appointment.

Infrared Coagulation (IRC) is a non-invasive, non-surgical hemorrhoids treatment. Many medical studies found IRC to be the non-surgical hemorrhoids treatment of choice because it is fast, well tolerated by patients, and virtually problem free. A small probe contacts the area above the hemorrhoids, exposing the tissue to a quick pulse of infrared light. This coagulation the vein above the hemorrhoids causing the hemorrhoids to shrink and recede. The patient may feel a slight sensation of heat but our Infrared Coagulation hemorrhoid treatment is generally not painful. Therefore, anesthesia is not required.
